

The regular monthly meeting of Yoe Borough Council was held August 1, 1972, at 7 p.m. in the Fire Company building, E. George St., Yoe, and was called to order by the President, Charles Landis, Jr.

The minutes were approved as read with the following change: the word testing was added in reference to having a time limit for motor bikes and motorcycles.

A discussion on the minibike nuisance revealed that the boys have settled down.

Ronald Crull will check on the complaint of Mrs. Wilmer Stover in reference of rain damage near her Alley.

Discussion on flood damage revealed that streets and alleys are in need of immediate repairs and that the State and Federal inspectors did not make a physical inspection of the Borough, as of this date. The secretary was asked to contact John Folmer and ask if he took pictures of flood damage and if not contact Charles Landis and he will do it.

The emergency repairs are: 1. Broad and Poplar Street.
 2. Howard and Charles Sts. on Clark Alley.
 3. Fern Alley.
 4. S. Park Alley.
 5. S. Maple St. between Penna. Ave. and Water St.
 6. Broad St. between Poplar and Orchard St.
 7. Walnut St. between Mason Alley and Newton Alley.
 8. Penna. Ave. between Main St. and Mason Alley.
 9. Philadelphia St.

It was decided that two contractors will be taken to the damaged areas separately and then give an estimate to the Road Committee.

A motion was made by Ronald Crull second by Bob Poff to authorize the Road Committee to take care of the nine priority problems mentioned above and then award bids before the next meeting so the damaged areas can be completed immediately. Motion carried.

It was noted that the creek pollution from Gichner Mobile Systems, Inc was made known to Elvin Hoover, Regional Sanitary Engineer of Lewistown.

Crull was advised by Landis to check all correspondence concerning the water course coming from Denton Terrace with Gordon Brown before he contacts his lawyer of property damage caused by excess water in this area.

Paul Forry a farmer does not leave an edge near the Alley on S. Taylor Ave. and when it rains, mud is washed onto the Alley. The road committee will notify Forry and request him try to eliminate the problem. It was suggested that quarry waste be applied to the Alley. The road committee will check the situation and make a decision.

The parking problem on the church property is under control according to a statement from Russell Wantz, Jr.

The secretary will contact the Department of Transportation and request two signs to read "No Parking Between Signs" be placed on the north side of West George Street. Also to ask the Department how much distance between signs and that the first sign should be placed 50' from the intersection and the second should be placed near the first curve.

A form from the Corps of Engineers requesting the high-water marks on Borough bridges will be filled out by the secretary on information received by Wayne Breighner.

Gerald Ruth reported that he contacted William Sacra on a solution for the water course problem on Elm Street and that Sacra stated he would have someone at this meeting to present the solution and approximate cost. The main thought revealed a need for an immediate temporary solution and the permanent solution would be pipe laid underground during the time of sewer collection lines construction. Ruth recommended that a letter be sent to Denton Fitz stating the solution as presented by Sacra's office and the cost and tell him he is obligated for a certain amount of the costs or we will take legal action.

Landis will contact William Sacra on a temporary solution.

A letter from the Gas Company was read and stated that they would like Borough Council to pass a Resolution that would contain our backing for finding new places and drilling of natural gas because of their concern of a gas shortage. No action taken at this time.

All councilmen present favored taxing 18 year olds beginning January, 1973 and Ruth will notify Charles Kelley, Per Capita Supervisor of this intent.

It was pointed out by the Mayor that William Seitz stated he no longer owns the building on W. George St. and that he turned it over to the State. Ruth will check further.

A review of the Ordinances presented by Ruth were amended and will be presented at another meeting. The Ordinance on Housing will be reviewed by councilmen between meetings.

The garbage collection agreement will be reviewed by Ruth and advertising for bids will be placed by him the same as last year to be opened at the special meeting August 31, at 7:30 p.m.

A motion was made by Ronald Crull second by Bob Poff to pay the bills as read by the secretary and typed at the end of these minutes except the bill from Denton Fitz on repairs made near Elm Street. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Max Eberly second by Wayne Breighner to adjourn. Motion carried. Adjournment at 10:25 p.m.
