Minutes

Councilman Snyder asked if everyone had a chance to review the minutes from the prior meeting. There is a correction on page 1, paragraph 4, should say "these are". Councilman Noll made a motion to approve the minutes from the prior meeting. Seconded by Councilman Bankoske. All in favor, minutes accepted.

Even with the absences of Councilmembers we still have a quorum.

Visitors Report

Mr. Myers was in attendance to ask if Councilman Snyder could work on the resolution for the Fire Department's gun raffle. The event will be on June 18th.

Maintenance Report

Mr. Myers would like to build a temporary stop sign. Councilman Harper made a motion for Mr. Myers to purchase or fabricate a temporary stop sign. Seconded by Councilman Bankoske. All in favor, motion carried.

Mr. Myers would also like to clean up the shop and organize. Councilman Claycomb is also working on this. Mr. Myers would like to work with Mr. Claycomb on this.

Diana would like one of the old conference room tables to be taken to the park and get rid of the old white table that is currently at the park.

Mr. Myers is also trying to get ahold of Ream Roofing to check the roof for leaks.

Engineer's Report

Report provided. C.S. Davidson sent down an application for payment for Clearview Excavating, for the South Mason AVE repair. Councilman Noll made a motion to pay Clearview Excavating in the amount of \$14,412.00, one-time payment. Seconded by Councilman Bankoske. All in favor, motion carried.

The Christ Church curb and sidewalk permit is with PennDOT. PennDOT is making additional requests, hopefully the permit will be released soon. Discussion continued.

The Dam inspection was completed. There are some recommendations. The Stormwater Ordinance will be sent to Council for review this month. The Sewer Maintenance program has started. The CDBG work is being started.

C.S. Davidson did meet with Mayor Sanford for a meeting with FEMA. FEMA did say that the Engineer's expenses will be covered, as well as the Mayor's time. The gabion baskets were discussed. FEMA did ask that the Borough upgrade those, to a more substantial design. Discussion continued.

Solicitor's Report

Report provided. Documents provided to Chief Stump for the Volunteer Fire Fighter Tax Credit. There is a meeting scheduled with Republic Services on Thursday to discuss issues with trash collection. Discussion continued. Council is not interested in changing the collection day at this point.

Councilman Snyder is still working with Attorney Fraga regarding the Shentel contract. Councilman Snyder updated Council on the progress of the contract. However, this no contract to sign as of today, the last contact was the first week of January.

Maintenance Report

There was some damage to the salt spreader on the F550. The truck was taken to Douglas for repair.

The CoStars salt contract is due by March. Discussion of how much to order. Consensus is 144 tons. Mayor Sanford said we are having problems with the skid loader; it does not have the reach to stack the salt as high.

Zoning Officer's Report

There were several letters sent out regarding snow not being removed from sidewalks.

EMA Report

Mayor Sanford has paperwork from the County regarding the reappointment of EMA coordinator.

Mayor's Report

Report provided. There has been a lot of time spent on the grant application for FEMA.

Mayor Sanford provided a list of badge numbers for the York County Regional Police, to Diana to file.

There were some incidents in the Borough – most recently on Sunday. Some juveniles were at the park and had started a fire in the firepit at the park. Diana checked the cameras on Monday and discovered that one of the cameras had been moved. In addition, the two juveniles involved in that incident, the kids were on the roof of the pavilion.

Mayor Sanford attended a PSAB seminar on parliamentary procedure, handout available for anyone who would like to review.

Secretary's Report

There is a resident who is having an issue with fox. Council suggested calling the Game Commission.

The Cougars would like to utilize the ballfield again this year. They emailed their proposal along with proof of insurance. Councilman Noll made a motion to approve the Cougars for the 2022 Season to use the baseball field. Seconded by Councilman Harper. All in favor, motion carried.
