Minutes

Councilman Snyder asked if everyone had a chance to review the minutes from the prior meeting. Councilman Sprenkle made a motion to accept the minutes, seconded by Councilman Claycomb. All others in favor, minutes accepted.

Visitor's Report

Andrew Warntz is here from Republic Services for the bid opening.

Engineer's Report

Report provided. We expect to have bids for Street Maintenance at the next months meeting. Mayor Sanford spoke with a Supervisor from Rabbit Transit, because we are in the stop hopper route there is no significant probability of getting a bus stop in the Borough. The Borough could consider putting a parking spot in on W Pennsylvania AVE for share ride services to potentially increase their chance for a grant. Discussion continued. The consensus of council is not to further pursue the multimodal grant. Discussion of additional grants applied for.

Sewer Billing Report

Nothing to report.

Solicitor's Report

Republic Services and Penn Waste submitted bids for the garbage contract. Republic Services put in a bid of \$425,024.64 over a three year period with carts. Republic did not submit a bid for pick up without carts. The toters would be billed per home per quarter. Penn Waste submitted a bid for \$503,451.65 over a three year period. Penn Waste did not submit a bid for pick up with carts. The Republic bid is for one cart per home. If an additional cart would be needed the Borough would be billed per cart per quarter. Also, the Republic bid not mention bulk pick up. Discussion continued. Councilman Harper made a motion to have the Solicitor review the Penn Waste bid contract to ensure it meets the requested criteria. Seconded by Councilman Noll. All in favor, motion carried.

Maintenance Report

Report provided. Douglas Equipment has a backhoe and is willing to do an even trade for the Kubota and corresponding accessories. Discussion continued. Councilman Noll made a motion to do an even trade for a 2019 Deere backhoe for our current Kubota skid loader that we give authority to do that following applicable municipal law and with the caveat that the new equipment is inspected, with the Borough paying for that prior to making a trade. Seconded by Councilman Harper. All in favor, motion carried.

Zoning Officer's Report

Patti has been out and is sending letters. There are a few issues the Mayor will get in touch with Diana about so Diana can relay them to Wayne.

EMA Report

Report provided. Still working on generator.

Mayor's Report

Report provided. There was an arson incident and some youth admitted to setting the fire and have been charged. There was some marijuana confiscated at the apartments at Walnut Street. Mayor Sanford has been in touch with Judge Larid regarding the signage at the park and ballfield. Our current signs have sufficient verbiage. Dallastown Borough has a sign shop, and they can make signs for us.

The Fire Department parade route has changed again. Main Street and Broad St roads will be closed, and traffic rerouted.

Secretary's Report

All the paperwork has been submitted to PLIGIT; we have not heard anything back yet.

The York County SPCA will no longer accept residents dropping off dogs. Dogs must be surrendered by an Animal Control Officer, Police Officer or the Dog Warden. The Borough does not have an Animal Control Officer and we will default to the Dog Warden. Discussion continued.
