

The regular monthly meeting of Yoe Borough Council was held September 5, 1972 at 8 p.m. in the Fire Company building, E. George St., Yoe, and was called to order by the President, Charles G. Landis, Jr.

The minutes of the previous meeting was approved as read.

Shoff reported that Yoe Borough would be charged \$100.00 for both the summer and winter recreational program which does not include swimming. He also reported that York Township would send \$100.00 to Yoe Borough toward the swimming program because they had more participants than Yoe. Shoff will check with York Township as to when they will send us the check.

A motion was made by Ronald Crull second by Charles Gross to send a \$100.00 check to the Dallastown Recreation Commission for both the summer and winter recreational program. Motion carried.

Wantz questioned Council on where it stands in reference to the present police department set-up. Since a recent news article stated that the Mayor attended a meeting at York Township regarding a unified police department with them, Wantz was doubtful as to how Council felt on continuing in the same way. The Mayor did note several areas of present procedure being unsatisfactory. Solicitor Ruth suggested that the Mayor should inform Council of the complaints against the police officers. Landis reported that Mayor Smith will give a recommendation to Council when he hears from York Township.

Landis stated that Red Lion Borough invited surrounding municipalities including Yoe Borough to a meeting to discuss a water supply source and need to be held Wednesday, September 6, 1972 at 7:30 p.m. at Warners Dairyland.

Percy Sechrist reported that the Water Authority will replace a 6" line with an 8" line from Park St. reservoir to pick up Colonial Products Co., Gichner Mobile Systems and Merchant Box Factory.

The creek bank at the Stover residence will be taken care of.

Discussion was again held on the water course problem that runs off the Fitz development. Landis stated that the apartment buildings in that area are contributing water in that zone in a minor way with, of course.

the Fitz development being the prime factor. Landis stated that Denton Fitz will build a holding basin and take a pipe out and recap with a suitable cap that won't wash out and raise Crull's drive several inches, build up macadem in front of Gemmills to assure water will flow into the drain, build up macadam shoulder on Third St. to prevent water from going on Fern Alley. On Fern Alley, rear of Philadelphia St. he will put shoulder and redesign water course; macadam shoulder on Philadelphia St. on upper end of Rohrbaugh's property; redo macadam on Third St. up to the land development to form a holding basin.

Sacra recommended at a previous date that Randall Harmon the apartment owner should take the drainage underground to the Main St. area.

The secretary was asked to contact John Folmer of Sacra's office and find out about the bids for Yoe for flood damages and state that all bidders should have the same information.

No further investigation of the Seitz property was done at this date.

Gerald Ruth tried without success to contact Charles Fetrow to be sure he knew the garbage contract is set up for a five-year period.

The "No Parking" signs for W. George St. was shelved for now after a letter from the State Department of Transportation stated that the Borough can install these signs without consent from the Department.

Gerald Ruth reported that it would be legal to request any landlords to give names of renters to the Borough for per capita taxing purposes.

A motion was made by Charles Gross second by Max Eberly to pay the bills as read by the secretary and typed at the end of these minutes. Motion carried.

The Mayor reported that the band shell in the Borough Park was damaged after it had been patched.

A motion was made by Charles Gross second by Ronald Crull to adjourn. Motion carried. Adjournment at 10:15 p.m.
